

RWE Gas Slovakia also supplies gas to medium-sized enterprises

RWE Gas Slovakia will be providing natural gas supply for medium-sized enterprises with consumption above 1 GWh (100,000 m³) from 2010. Subsidiary of the Czech RWE Transgas, a.s. follows up the successful entry into the gas market this year. Currently it supplies gas to customers among large enterprises with consumption of 2.1 TWh (210 million m³), reaching a 10% market share of large industrial users category.

New segment

“We respond to interest in this market segment with offer for gas supply to medium-sized enterprises,” clarifies the reason of extending the business activities Martin Herrmann, CEO of the parent RWE Transgas. **“Company not only offers gas supply for coming year, but for 2011 too”** he added.

RWE Transgas has shown its qualities as one of the key players, engaging with the gas crisis in Slovakia in January.
